MONICA IKEGWU



Monica Ikegwu (b.1998) is a Baltimore-based visual artist. She is a figure painter with a focus directed towards black portraiture. With her work she aims to give people a platform to display themselves in the way that they truly are without any limitations. She earned her BFA in painting at the Maryland Institute College of Art and her MFA at the New York Academy of Art.

She has been named as a Bennett Art Prize finalist (2022), is a recipient of the Elizabeth Greenshields Foundation grant (2020), and has been awarded as a first place winner in the AXA Art prize (2018). Her work was recently displayed at The Baltimore Museum of Arts past exhibition The Culture: Hip Hop and Contemporary Art in the 21st Century, had work featured in the Venice Biennale exhibition The Afro-Futurist Manifesto:

Blackness Reimagined, and her work was apart of the third rendition of the Bennett Art Prize Rising Voices exhibition held at the Muskegon Museum of Art. Her work has been acquired by the Baltimore Museum of Art and the Petrucci Family Foundation.

MONICA IKEGWU - Artist Statement

Over the years I have always focused on painting people in a way that allows their true selves to be seen. What I have come to notice is that personality comes through more when surrounded by those you feel comfortable with. This show is a continued focus on people, but with an emphasis on the relationships between two entities and how they influence one another. This focus on two has more to do with the idea of connection. I could go on with three, four, and even a hundred, but for me I believe a one to one connection is the strongest.

The idea of "two" is explored in several ways that go past just by having two figures together on a canvas. Within the thirteen works, I am looking at gestures between two people, the relationship of two people when divided, and even observing the interaction between the viewer and a singular figure.

The people that surround us affect and determine who we will become. In order to grasp the full picture of a person, it is necessary to examine their attitudes when they are in communion with others they care about.

VICTORIA CASSINOVA



Victoria Cassinova (b. 1993, Baton Rouge, LA) is a Los Angeles-based visual artist whose work ranges from murals and graphic art to illustration, drawing, and painting. Solo and group exhibitions of her work have been presented at galleries such **Thinkspace** Projects-Los Angeles, Vertical Gallery-Chicago, Band of Vices-Los Angeles, Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum-Honolulu and Spoke Art- San Francisco, Volery Gallery- Dubai, among others. Cassinova's work has also served as an integral contribution to many social justice collaborations, including Blackout for Human Right's annual MLK NOW event, We Rise Exhibition, Sons & Bros., Truth Initiative and more. Branded works include Urban Outfitters, Condè Nast with Proactiv & Teen Vogue, Netflix, TIME Magazine, Disney, CNN and Adidas.

VICTORIA CASSINOVA - Artist Statement

Victoria Cassinova's work claims agency over the body from the female perspective, and contemplates the intersection of identity and spirituality. From oil painting to graphite drawings, she's inspired by the dualistic nature between the female experience and the spiritual realm. She works primarily in oil paint and graphite pencil to create bold figurative compositions, shifting between canvas and works on paper. Her creative process is heavily influenced by photography and the use of photographic techniques to create her own reference images. Cassinova combines photographic works with self-portraits, as references, to depict the feminine form in sensual yet assertive postures in order to illuminate the transformative process of self-examination. Through the shadows of her own experience, she dedicates her work as a cathartic outlet of public confession to serve not as sources of fear, but as pathways to growth, empowerment, and self-acceptance through the feminine gaze.

TOMMY MITCHELL



Tommy Mitchell (born in 1983 in Biloxi, Mississippi). Relocating to Virginia in the late 80s, Tommy would draw a myriad of things from magazine covers to basketball cards. Out of high school, he began working numerous retail jobs before coming back to his calling in the arts.

Tommy's choice of ballpoint pen comes from friendly competition with a classmate. Whereas the classmate had mentioned that her grandmother used ballpoint pen to minimize her mistakes, Mitchell followed suit. Self taught, Tommy studied tattoo artists for their attention to detail and execution with ink. Tommy now lives and works in Baltimore.

TOMMY MITCHELL - Artist Statement

Working in portraiture, Mitchell uses ink from a ballpoint pen to achieve true depth and precision in his practice. The ballpoint pen allows him to create realism, which Is juxtaposed with acrylic paint and mixed media to compliment the detail in the subject matter.

The subjects depict emotions of longing, solidarity and reflection and serves as the central protagonist in the work.

Mitchell referenced fashion photography, along with religious elements in order to achieve an empowering representation of people of color in an attempt to complicate the notions of ideal beauty.




