INTRODUCES THE SOLO EXHIBITION OF RICHARD MENSAH IN LOS ANGELES, CA


Embracing the entanglement of emotions and artistry, Band of Vices proudly introduces 'TANGLED EMBRACE,' a showcase unveiling the latest paintings by the esteemed London-based artist, Richard Mensah. Delve into 7 intimately crafted pieces, each a testament to precision and vulnerability. This exhibition marks Mensah's premiere solo display at the gallery, open for viewing from November 11th to December 23rd, 2023.

Originally from Ghana, Mensah weaves together a visual storybook of requited love and those yearning for intimacy. While the threats of the outside world distract these lovers of their full expression, they are threading their own journey to hold on as tightly as they can to one another.

Combining materials like oil, acrylic, faux leather, jute rope, gold leaf and marble dust, Mensah provides the viewer a complex storytelling of tenderness, while cautious. Formany of these subjects, their love is both a blessing and a curse.

RICHARD MENSAH

ARTIST BIOGRAPHY

Richard Mensah (b. 1978, Ghana) is a London based artist who works with and paints in different media. He describes himself as a born artist as he has had no formal art/painting education or training. His love for drawing, sketching and painting was noticed at a very young age and in the very early years of his education in Ghana where he was born.

He moved to the United Kingdom in the early 2000s and after a break from art for more than 15 years, Richard started painting again circa 2016 and has since been involved in exhibitions and commissions.

His style is mainly intuitive - he conceives an idea to paint but often starts the painting project before the idea is fully formed. He relies on his intuitions to bring his ideas and concept into reality. This mainly means that he does very little preparation before commencing any paintings and doesn't always know how the pieces of ideas come together to fully bring the concept into reality. His key guiding principle for every painting project is with patience every painting always ends well. He is driven by the need to tell the African and Black peoples story from their own perspective which is often missing in the art world. His paintings attempt to draw in audiences into the event or the story being told thereby bringing it to life for the audience.

His paintings also use a lot of different items as symbolism with often a lot of research behind them. These are often left for audiences to find and interpret and or use their visual imagination to fill missing gaps in the story. He takes inspiration from his African heritage, childhood memories and everyday happenings and is very passionate about social issues. He does not limit himself in his work; he paints and creates as inspired. His love of colours, nature and fascination about everyday life scenes show through his work.

He is deeply fascinated by shapes, movement and shades and light and tries to capture these in his paintings. His paintings and creations are vivid, bright bold colours, captures various emotions and combines abstract and realism.

Richard has exhibited in the UK and internationally and was selected in 2020 as one of 25 emerging artists in the UK to watch out for by a Mayfair gallery. He has also been shortlisted and longlisted for numerous awards including the 2021 Royal Academy of Arts Summer Exhibition, the Robert Walters Group UK New Artist of the Year Award and the Jacksons Painting Prize.


ARTIST STATEMENT

TANGLED EMBRACE is a series of multi-media paintings that explores the profound and complex connections shared between black couples across the global African diaspora.

By combining canvas, oil paint, leather, and a jute rope, the series aims to evoke the intertwining narratives, experiences, and emotions that bind these couples together. The use of canvas and oil paint forms the foundation of the pieces, symbolizing the traditional medium of artistic expression. It represents the strength and resilience of black love throughout history, as well as the timeless beauty found within these relationships. The vibrant colors and expressive brushstrokes communicate the vitality and passion that exist within the bonds of black couples.

Integrating leather into the pieces speaks to the idea of protection and strength. Leather, a durable and resilient material, represents the ability to weather challenges and adversity. It signifies the protective embrace that black couples provide for one another, as well as the ways in which they navigate societal pressures and systemic barriers together.

The inclusion of a jute rope introduces an element of interconnection and interdependence. The rope symbolizes the ties that bind black couples, representing vtheir shared experiences, struggles, and triumphs that they navigate as a unit. It also highlights the importance of communication, trust, and mutual support in fostering healthy and thriving relationships. Tangled Embrace seeks to celebrate the beauty and complexity of black love, while acknowledging the unique dynamics and challenges faced by black couples. Through its multi-media composition, the artworks invites viewers to reflect on the interconnectedness of these relationships and to appreciate the strength and resilience







embodied within them.










Richard Mensah, Embrace, 2023




Richard Mensah, On the Cusp, 2023














Richard Mensah, The Interupt, 2023




